### New this quarter

The CIB reached financial close on two new loans in Q3. There are now 89 projects under construction and 11 projects have been completed.

### Wicehtowak Solar

*Clean Power, Indigenous Infrastructure / Rural Municipality of Dufferin, Saskatchewan*

**\$42M** loan towards George Gordon First Nation development corporation's sustainable energy project. Wicehtowak Solar will deliver 32.4 MW of renewable energy to the Saskatchewan grid and power the nearby K+S Potash Canada mine. The project supports meaningful economic reconciliation, creates renewable energy jobs and training opportunities for community members, as well as supporting the potash mine's operations and expansion plan.

### North Coast Transmission Line Early Works

*Clean Power / Northern British Columbia*

**\$139.5M** loan in partnership with BC Hydro to advance early works on the North Coast Transmission Line (NCTL). Early works support the construction readiness of the NCTL and includes project planning, engineering, fieldwork, procurements, consultation with Indigenous communities and stakeholder engagement. The proposed NCTL will unlock energy capacity in BC's Northwest, drive economic growth, support jobs, attract investment into the region and advance clean power generation.



### Another completion

#### Benjamins Mill Wind

*Clean Power / Hants County, Nova Scotia*

This 34-MW wind farm in Nova Scotia is now complete. The partnership between the CIB, Wskijinu'k Mtmo'taqtanuow Agency and Natural Forces supported the installation of eight turbines in the region, which will assist the province's emission reduction goals and provide a reliable source of energy for local businesses, including the Port Hawkesbury Paper Mill. Benjamins Mill Wind will also deliver cost-effective, clean power to 13,000 homes in Nova Scotia.
