Project highlights

Contrecoeur Port Terminal

Trade and Transportation / Quebec

\$1.16B loan to the Montreal Port Authority supports construction of a new container terminal. Identified as a project of national importance by the federal government, the project will strengthen Canada's eastern trade gateway, expand container handling capacity and improve supply chain resilience in Quebec and Ontario. Contrecoeur will support close to 400,000 jobs linked to the regional supply chain while helping meet growing trade demand.

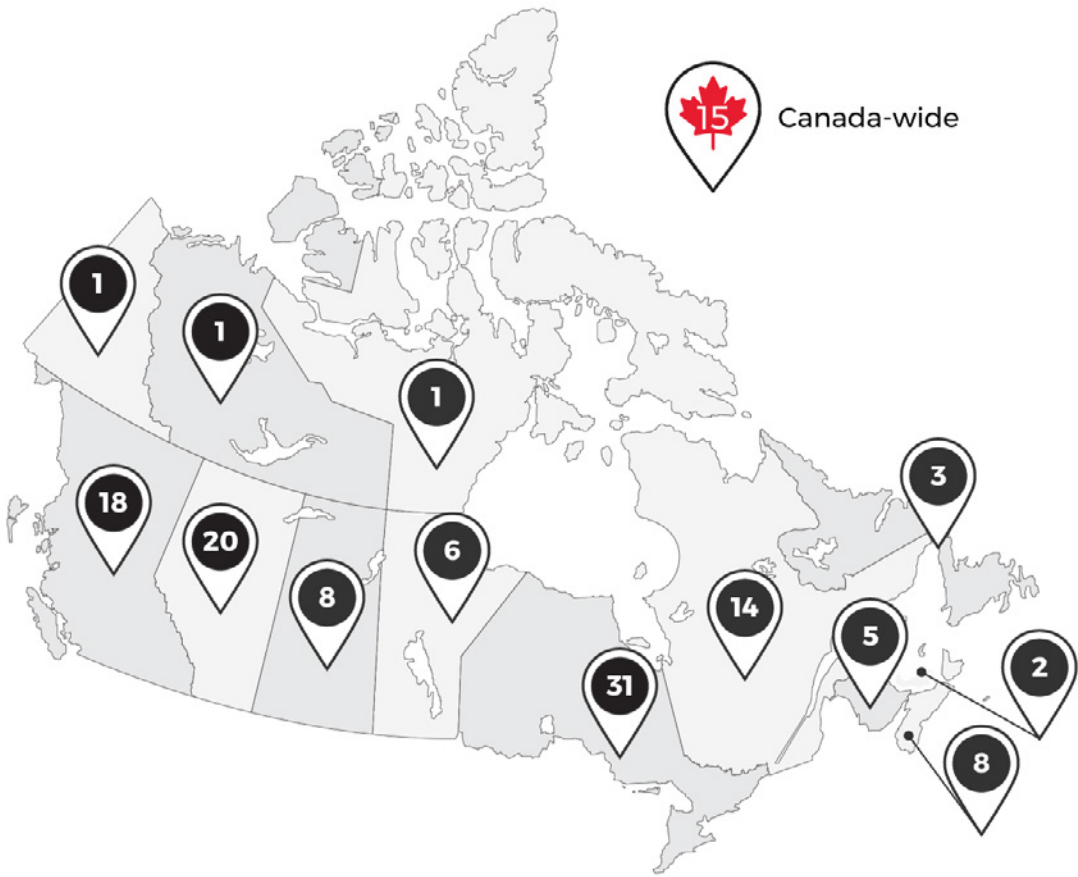
Rose Valley Wind

Clean Energy, Indigenous Infrastructure / Saskatchewan

\$128M project loan and \$36.4M Indigenous equity loan in partnership with Potentia Renewables Inc. and M-Squared Renewables. The project will generate up to 210 MW of renewable electricity from 28 wind turbines, reducing energy emissions by approximately 298,000 tonnes annually. Rose Valley Wind advances Indigenous ownership and economic reconciliation while generating long-term revenues for the 10 participating First Nations and delivering affordable clean power to Saskatchewan.

Central East Transfer-Out Transmission Line

Clean Energy / Alberta

The Central East Transfer-Out Transmission Line is now complete with 130 km of new transmission lines deployed across Alberta. Our \$283.5M loan in partnership with AltaLink, L.P and ATCO Electric Ltd. is enabling more than 750 MW of electrical capacity to strengthen the reliability of the province's energy system and increase access to renewable electricity generation.
