Sturgeon Terminal West

Trade & Transportation / Fort Saskatchewan, Alberta

\$100 million loan in partnership with Cando Rail & Terminals will expand its Sturgeon Terminal. This expansion will strengthen Western Canada's supply chains by facilitating the transportation of Canadian goods to national and global markets, creating up to 50 new full-time jobs and doubling the terminal's capacity by adding up to 3,700 new railcar storage and staging spaces.

Saint John Mill Modernization

Clean Power / Saint John, New Brunswick

\$660 million loan in partnership with Irving Pulp & Paper to support the modernization of the Saint John westside pulp mill with a new recovery boiler, steam turbine and generator. Once upgraded, the mill will generate up to 145MW of renewable energy and surplus power will be exported to the provincial grid. The CIB's loan supports one of New Brunswick's largest employers and exporters and the project will create more than 600 new jobs across the forestry supply chain.
